### Veterans' Home Care Services Available.

Our Veterans' Home Care (VHC) program provides eligible DVA clients and eligible dependants with access to services to help them remain independent and in their homes. It offers the following services:

- domestic assistance
- personal care
- respite care, and
- safety-related home and garden maintenance.

To receive these services you will first need an assessment. You're eligible for an assessment if you hold either a Veteran White Card for an accepted service-related injury or condition or a Veteran Gold Card. Carers and family members of Gold and White Card holders with an accepted service-related condition may also be eligible for an assessment.

# CHRISTMAS Remembering Jesus' Birthday

### **OLD TESTAMENT**

Truths pointing to Jesus Coming:



Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign: The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel. (Isaiah 7:14) (c 700 BC).

For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Of the increase of his government and peace there will be no end. He will reign on David's throne and over his kingdom, establishing and upholding it with justice and righteousness from that time on and forever. The zeal of the Lord Almighty will accomplish this. (Isaiah 9:6-7) (c 700 BC).

A shoot will come up from the stump of Jesse; from his roots a Branch will bear fruit. The Spirit of the Lord will rest on him the Spirit of wisdom and of understanding, the Spirit of counsel and of power, the Spirit of knowledge and of the fear of the Lord - and he will delight in the fear of the Lord. He will not judge by what he sees with his eyes, or decide by what he hears with his ears; but with righteousness he will judge the needy, with justice he will give decisions for the poor of the earth. He will strike the earth with the rod of his mouth; with the breath of his lips he will slay the wicked. Righteousness will be his belt and faithfulness the sash around his waist. (Isaiah 11:1-5) (c 700 BC) (cf Revelation 19) (AD 95).

"The time is coming," declares the Lord, "when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and with the house of Judah. It will not be like the covenant I made with their forefathers when I took them by the hand to lead them out of Egypt, because they broke my covenant, though I was a husband to them, "declares the Lord. "This is the covenant I will make with the house of Israel after that time," declares the Lord. "I will put my law in their minds and write it on their hearts. I will be their God, and they will be my people. (Jeremiah 31:31-33 (c 600 BC).

"But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, though you are small among the clans of Judah, out of you will come for me one who will be ruler over Israel, whose origins are from of old, from ancient times." (Micah 5:2) (c 700 BC).

"See, I will send my messenger, who will prepare the way before me. Then suddenly the Lord you are seeking will come to his temple; the messenger of the covenant, whom you desire, will come," says the Lord Almighty. "See, I will send you the prophet Elijah before that great and dreadful day of the Lord comes. (Malachi 3:1, 4:5) (c430BC).

The Messenger (Elijah) is John the Baptist to prepare the way for Jesus and His New Covenant.

### **NEW TESTAMENT**


### Jesus is born:

This is how the birth of Jesus Christ came about: His mother Mary was pledged to be married to Joseph, but before they came together, she was found to be with child through the Holy Spirit. Because Joseph her husband was a righteous man and did not want to expose her to public disgrace, he had in mind to divorce her quietly. But after he had considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins." All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: "The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel" --which means, "God with us." (Matthew 1:18-23).

In the time of Herod King of Judea there was a priest named Zechariah, who belonged to the priestly division of Abijah; his wife Elizabeth was also a descendant of Aaron. Both of them were upright in the sight of God, observing all the Lord's commandments and regulations blamelessly. But they had no children, because Elizabeth was barren; and they were both well along in years. Once when Zechariah's division was on duty and he was serving as priest before God, he was chosen by lot, according to the custom of the priesthood, to go into the temple of the Lord and burn incense. And when the time for the burning of incense came, all the assembled worshipers were praying outside. Then an angel of the Lord

appeared to him, standing at the right side of the altar of incense. When Zechariah saw him, he was startled and was gripped with fear. But the angel said to him: "Do not be afraid, Zechariah; your prayer has been heard. Your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you are to give him the name John. (Luke 1:5-13).

In the sixth month, God sent the angel Gabriel to Nazareth, a town in Galilee, to a virgin pledged to be married to a man named Joseph, a descendant of David. The virgin's name was Mary. The angel went to her and said, "Greetings, you who are highly favoured! The Lord is with you." Mary was greatly troubled at his words and wondered what kind of greeting this might be. But the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, you have found favour with God. You will be with child and give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his father David, and he will reign over the house of Jacob forever; his kingdom will never end." (Luke 1:26-33).



## Remembering Bill the Bastard — Australia's Greatest War Horse

### From pack horse to legend

Bill's military life began at Sydney's Liverpool Army Camp, used by recruiting officers to test the skill and strength of would-be light horsemen.

After bucking each eager recruit with ease, Bill was labelled unrideable and delegated to work as a pack horse carting supplies and munitions.

Along with 130,000 other Australian war horses, Bill began his voyage to the Middle East in late 1914, cared for by bush poet and war correspondent 'Banjo' Paterson, who later commanded the Australian Remount Squadron.

During the journey, Paterson noted in his diary: "you can't lead Bill the Bastard to anything and you certainly can't make him drink".

After arriving in Egypt, Bill was sent with Anzac troops to the shores of Gallipoli. He began work as a pack horse and eventually carried the body of war hero John Simpson

from the battlefield after his death on May 19, 1915.

Journeying between Suvla Bay and Anzac Cove, Bill suffered two gunshot wounds. One bullet was never removed.

It was during his recovery that Bill became inseparable from Major Michael Shanahan, who grew determined to break-in Bill and become his rider.

Major Shanahan adopted a strategy of whispers, pats and licorice all-sorts, soon earning Bill's trust and becoming the only man to ever ride him in battle.

It wasn't until the **Battle of Romani on August 5, 1916**, however, that Bill and Major

Fighting off Turkish troops, the pair rescued four stranded Tasmanian soldiers, who piled onto Bill as he rode almost three miles to return them to safety. (Ed. Bill carried 5 men, 3 on top

Returning to battle, Major Shanahan passed out on top of Bill after suffering a gunshot wound to his left leg, which was later amoutated once Bill returned him safely to base.

Bill survived the war but was unable to return to Australia. He died in 1924 at the age of 21 and is buried at Walker's Ridge in Gallipoli.

Major Shanahan's grandson Terry Shanahan is still affected by the weight of his grandfather's bravery. "It's hard to describe. You're very proud of him, it brings tears to

the eyes," he said.

"You wish to hell that you'd spent more time with him."

After losing his leg in the Battle of Romani, Major Shanahan continued to ride horses.(Supplied: Terry Shanahan)

Helping to capture the likeness of Major Shanahan in the statue, Terry Shanahan said his



grandfather's loyalty to his fellow soldiers had no limits.

"Just imagine doing that, riding the horse up and down, the shell fire going, the bullets whizzing here and there and taking complete disregard for that, just looking after all of his men." After a century's passage, Mr Shanahan said the stories of the First World War were just as relevant as ever, despite the reluctance of traumatised soldiers to recount them.

"After we go through wars, we try to forget," he said. "A lot of people don't talk about what they did in the war. "It's only now when people are recognised or have physical or



mental damage that people are accepting that."

Sculptor Carl Valerius enlisted the help of a vet to build a skeleton for Bill's statue to ensure accuracy.

## AK-47 gun-maker Kalashnikov to launch fleet of electric vehicles

The infamous Russian arms giant is going green, with two production electric vehicles seemingly in development.



Russian arms maker Kalashnikov – best known for inventing the AK-47 semi-automatic rifle – could be preparing to launch a fleet of small electric vehicles, new patent images suggest. ©

The filings – which were uncovered by international motoring outlet *Carscoops©* – reveal a five-door four-wheeler largely inspired by the 2018 Izh UV-4 concept, and an open-sided three-wheeler.

According to the documents, the former measures 3400mm from nose to tail, 1500mm from side to side, and 1700mm at its tallest point.

# May 20th, 1915, and Courtney's Post – the forward most trench of the ANZAC sector at Gallipoli – is about to be overrun.

**22**-year-old Australian Albert Jacka is alone amongst his dead comrades, waiting for reinforcements, whilst firing shots along the trench, stemming the flow of advancing Turks who now hold the majority of the position.

When the reinforcements arrive, the Aussies are quick to launch a counter-attack, however the entire squad were soon pinned down, injured or killed - all except L/Cpl Jacka. Deciding to go alone, Jacka crept out of the trench system and into no-man's land. Crawling around through dead ground, Jacka re-entered from the rear of the now Turkish held trench, and singlehandedly killed 7 Turks (shooting 5 and bayonetting 2), causing the rest to fall back. He then held the position against heavy counter-attacks until reinforcements arrived to re-consolidate the position.



For his actions Jacka became the first Australian (of many) to be awarded the Victoria Cross during WW1. Becoming an instant celebrity back in Australia, Jacka had the option to return home to help the recruitment drive. Not believing in resting on his laurels, Jacka opted to fight on, and despite the Allied evacuated from Gallipoli in December 1915, the war was still far from over.

Jacka would finally be removed from the conflict in May 1918 at the rank of Captain, after he was badly gassed, and shrapnel passed through his Trachea. That's not to say however that he had no

other memorable moments during the war. Like when he earned the Military Cross during the battle of the Somme, charging a group of Germans who had taken 40 Australian prisoners; personally sustaining 7 injuries during the engagement (most notable being 2 head wounds and a gunshot wound to the shoulder); racking up 12-20 kills whilst retaking the line and capturing 50 Germans. He then earned a bar to his military cross after capturing more Germans whilst out on a reconnaissance patrol. He also got shot by a sniper and lead a successful attack against a pair of German Pillboxes.

After the War Jacka went on to marry, adopt a daughter, and in 1929 he was elected Bellingen town mayor, where much of his work was characterised by assisting the unemployed. In 1931 due to failing health and exhaustion he did not seek re-election and had to take a job as a traveling salesman where he struggled to make ends meet. After his wife left him, his health finally gave out, largely due to old wounds and the gassing he received in 1918. He died January 17th, 1932, one week after his 39th birthday.

His final words, spoken to his father, were, "I'm still fighting, Dad."
