
Coffee@C.ex – Every Thursday at 10.00 AM VISTA Lounge.





COFFS HARBOUR COMETS ANZAC OPENING 2025

(2.45pm Geoff King Oval delivered by VP Ian Johnston)

Good afternoon, everyone. We gather here to commemorate Anzac Day through this 2025 season opener, the annual Anzac Rugby League Match, today between the Coffs Comets and Macksville Sea Eagles.

I am Ian Johnston, Vice President of the RSL Coffs Harbour sub-Branch and your nominated rep to give the pre-game opening address on behalf of the Coffs Comets and the sub-branch.

We remember and honour those who have served, fought and made the ultimate sacrifice for our country. We also acknowledge the traditional owners of this Gumbaynggirr nation and acknowledge their enduring connection to its land and waters.

Anzac Day is one of the few days in our national calendar that all Australians can agree on. It's a day when we reflect on the sacrifices of those who paved the way for the freedoms that we enjoy and thus celebrate and commemorate their legacy.

The Anzac legend was born on 25 April 1915, 110 years ago, when some 16,000 soldiers of the Australian and New Zealand Army Corps (ANZAC) landed under fire on the shores of Gallipoli, Turkey. 60,000 Australians died during that war. Anzac Day became established as a National Day of Commemoration for these soldiers during the 1920s. From the dawn of our modern nation and that baptism of fire at Gallipoli, a spirit emerged. A spirit of mateship, of selflessness, of compassion & courage, - **the spirit of Anzac**. Rekindled in places like Kokoda, Long Tan and in Iraq and Afghanistan.

The ANZAC legend provides us all with a compelling opportunity to celebrate these values that remain embedded in our culture. There are countless examples of where these values have risen to the fore through Rugby League like Endurance: Anzacs demonstrated remarkable endurance in the face of adversity. They endured harsh conditions, long marches, and the horrors of battle without giving up.

Every year we honour the Anzac spirit. We honour those who created it and those who keep it alive today. Their spirit lives on in you, people like yourselves (*acknowledge the crowd*) and our players here. Thank you for respecting the day, thank you for respecting the Anzac Spirit. **'LEST WE FORGET'**.
